The Creation of The Third Personality

Some may raise questions about the ethics of the material presented in this chapter, so permit me to begin by saying that this book is not about ethics but is a survival manual for those who are royally screwed by the system. It is not a book about criminal endeavors, unless you are among the growing minority who are willing to consider freedom a crime. What is presented is a do it yourself manual for survival of those who are tired of being screwed by a system that considers the individual to be secondary to political objectives, corporate objectives, or politically correct thinking. This book presents a plan for the return of the individual to the period of pre world war two, when Americans were expected to make their own decisions and accept responsibility for those decisions. A period when the objective of government was the representation of the will of the people, and politicians were willing to admit and correct their errors. Think of prohibition. A huge percentage of the population chose to ignore the law, and new criminal enterprises were created to service that percentage of the population. The politicians had to admit that it was an unpopular law that could not be effectively enforced and removed it from the books. Now compare that to today's "war on drugs". The situation is exactly the same, except today politicians can not reconsider their position, but must fight on without end, against an action that a major segment of the population are willing to accept. They fight this battle at a great loss of personal liberty, at a great expense to the taxpayers, and in a situation where the end product is a nation with a larger percentage of its citizens in prison than any other first world nation. This is progress? Now please understand why a segment of this population has decided to just drop out and not take part.

At this point we have developed our business personality. That business personality is generating revenue and profit. That profit is flowing into our offshore stash, and we have

a little money to work with. Our expatriate personality has been created and the minimum amount of paperwork exists to show that you have left the shores of this nation, and are now living in your grass shack in Walla Walla land, are a missionary in Costa Rica or you are running a bar in the Philippines. Even as an expatriate, you do have the right to come home for a visit once in a while. Under federal regulations you are permitted to come home for thirty days in the first year, and thereafter for up to 180 days so long as you maintain your domicile in the other nation.

Exactly what you do with the third personality depends on your current situation. The first situation is that you have no current problems with credit, bureau rats, the IRS or anyone. You are just trying to find that little bit of freedom. In this case you simply let the old personality fade away. Each of the following steps is appropriate.

- File your income taxation as a schedule C, via IRS international and claim the expatriate exemption.
- When your driving license comes up for renewal, fail to renew it and just drive on your expatriate license. Get an international drivers permit if one is required.
- If you are in an area with state income tax, just stop filing.
- When it comes up time to trade the car, sell this one and purchase a new one in the name of the corporation. Insure and license it in the name of the corporation. Use your “Mail box are us” corporate address for the registration and title.
- If you are well established with a doctor that has your social security number or insurance number, switch to a new doctor, and do not give that doctor a social security number. Just tell him you have none. Please remember that even if you have never provided a social security number, if you have ever used insurance, the insurance company provided the number.

- Send a change of address to each credit card company and give them your expatriate address. Most will close your account. Actually you want to close all of your old accounts and use only the ATM / Credit card you received with your expatriate account and the ATM /credit card you received with your corporate account.
- From your business enterprise you are putting your cash income in the cash box for you to spend, and depositing your checks and credit cards into the offshore bank account.
- You are transferring just enough from the corporate account to your expatriate account to let you write checks to pay your bills.
- Anything in the United States that requests your social security number you are ignoring. Never again give out that number to anyone. The answer is no.
- As soon as possible, you want to move from the physical address shown on your various computer records.
- Drop your magazine subscriptions. If you want to subscribe, take out a new subscription in the corporation name.
- By the end of two years, you should receive no mail addressed to you and should not still be doing business with anyone that had your social security number.

The second situation that must be addressed is those who are already in trouble with the IRS, with child support, with some other bureau rat somewhere. This may be the more common reader because Americans have the bad habit of believing that things like this can not happened to them, until it does. In this case you must make a more rapid, and

drastic divestiture of the old life. You are going to have to relocate your ass, immediately and in a way that does not leave a trace to follow. You must be yourself at the old location and your expatriate self at the new location. Each of the following might be good advice for you.

- If you own a home you are going to lose it. If you have very little equity, then check to see if there is a lien on it and if not sell the house. If there is a lien on it, then all you can do is walk away from it. In most major cities, there are guys that advertise that they will buy your house, money in 48 hours. If you are in a big hurry then go to them. If your situation is more that IRS is making threats or you just got hit with child support that you know you will not pay, then take a few months and dump the house.
- At your new location, rent a house or apartment in the name of the corporation. Tell the landlord that the apartment is for employee housing. Pay for it with a direct payment from the corporation and keep your name out of it. When you sign the lease, sign as agent for the corporation. You will pay a larger deposit, but there is no trace to you. Get the utilities and even the phone in the corporation name. You will live there, but the name on all records is the corporate name. No change of address.
- Your automobile is like a neon arrow pointing to you. Sell it or in that case where you can not get enough to clear the title, then just park it at the bank and walk away. You can get away with driving it for a while if you picked up foreign tags and put them on it. If you are going to hang on to it, send the state a change of address to your expatriate address. As fast as you can, get this car transferred (sold) to the corporate name or get a new car in the corporate name. Leasing a car in the name of an offshore corporation is just about impossible so you will have to pay cash. Insure the car in the corporate name, via a new agent and company. Register the car in the corporate name.

- Your credit bureau is also a neon arrow pointing directly to you. If you are ethical, cut up your credit cards immediately. If you are slightly less than ethical, then draw cash advances and max out the cards then cut them up. Do not send a change of address, just ignore the credit card companies.
- One thing that gets overlooked is your medical record. The medical profession operates a database just like the credit bureau. It is used to help protect doctors from malpractice claims and insurance companies from false claims. If you do not cut off all relationships with your doctor, that database will locate you just as easy as credit bureau traces. Go to a new doctor. Get new prescriptions. Give the new doctor the expatriate information and do not give a social security number. If he does not want to treat you without such a number, try a different doctor. I have found that you will have no problems if you just fill out the initial form, using a random number generator for the Social Security number.
- Do not move your magazine subscriptions. Get a new subscription, at the new address, in the corporation name. It is the simple things like magazine subscriptions that will trip you up. Immediately sever any connection between the new you and the old you.

Some of you that may read this have already been through the mill and you just want some way to pick up a piece or two of your life. In one case, a man I know had three heart attacks in one year. He was out of work for almost a year and got seven thousand dollars behind on his child support. He told them that the best he could do was pay an extra two hundred dollars per month. He started paying the extra. The bureau rats started their grind, and five years later he was down to something like one thousand dollars behind but then they served him with notice that his driving license had been suspended for non payment of child support, so he could not drive to work. No public transport to where he worked so he had no choice but ignore the notice. He spends his time worried that he will be stopped for some minor traffic offense. He also spends his time fighting

the depression that living in the United States has given him, and fights the battle you can not win, with the child support bureau rats.. I wish that man had come to me, but he ended up putting a 45 through his heart. His wife and my wife were sisters. Another man that did come to me for guidance had similar problems but with another agency. He had built a fast growing business in Houston, working as most small business men do, always in debt to the bank. His company had gone from two employees to fifty seven employees in less then two years. Suddenly, his bank went down in the bank failures of the 1980's and he could not withdraw his money. He had collected two hundred and thirty thousand dollars in social security and withholding taxes from his employees and could not pay the IRS. IRS came in like a ton of bricks, arrested his ass on a criminal charge of income tax fraud, seized the assets of his business, his home and even his car. They closed the business so that it could not create revenue to get him out of trouble, and in the process greatly decreasing its value at sale. They then held an auction and sold his business, all assets, his house and his car. The sale brought a total of thirty one thousand dollars. They then failed at their attempt to prosecute him for fraud, but then placed a garnishment on his pay check, for the rest of his life, in an attempt to collect the remaining two hundred thousand dollars. This is what bureau rats do, and they consider this productive. You are screwed and if the bureau rats have done a good job you will be screwed for the next twenty years, if not the rest of your life. They usually love to add interest and penalty to keep it going and going just like the little bunny rabbit in the commercial. This is job security to them.

The best thing you can do is just fold it up and walk away. Start your new life, in a new location, with exactly zero in your name. Put everything in the corporate name. Pay every item possible out of the corporate accounts. Get down to paying the food store with the point of sale from the corporation. Just fail to exist. Do absolutely nothing that involves a federal identification and learn to do everything for cash.

Just totally freeze out the bureau rats and the tax man. Go about a good life, and just fail to inform them that you exist. Fail to show up in any database that can tell them where

you are. Hell, even if you have an arrest warrant out, your expatriate status will usually protect you even from that. One of my associates has lived, loved, and run a good business in the United States, for over ten years, with an arrest warrant out for his wife, and he does not even worry about it.

Without regard for your situation, your third personality needs to disconnect from the system. The only thing that will change is the speed and urgency of the disconnection. You need to break each and every thread that can be traced with a common computer key, and replace that with a new thread that leads only to the offshore corporation or to the expatriate self. Without the computers, the only way that they can make a connection is if you find yourself in a situation where you are physically in police custody and are being fingerprinted. Go about your life, enjoy yourself, live a very full and complete life, just do not put your social security number and name in American database. Make sure that every time you show up in a database, it is as your corporation or your expatriate self. Rotate the corporations on an every five year cycle such that even the corporation does not have sufficient life to attract attention from the bureau rats.
